SYNOPSIS



ACT I

SCENE 1: A FAMILY CELEBRATION

A very long time ago in San Jose, California, there lived a young girl named Clara. Clara was gifted with a wonderful imagination, a courageous heart, and a kind soul. She loved to read and to imagine the adventures she might have exploring the big world outside her home.

One December afternoon, Clara and her brother Fritz were as excited as they could be! All of their friends and family were on their way to celebrate the holidays. There will be gifts and dancing, all the special things that make the season warm and magical. After a flurry of anticipation, the guests begin to arrive. Uncle Nikola is a very special guest indeed. He has given a wonderful new gift to Clara's family, electric lighting for their home, which he installed himself!

Gifts are given to all the children, with a splendid drum for Fritz, who loves music, and a mysterious wooden Nutcracker for Clara, a souvenir from Uncle Nikola's travels across the sea. Uncle Nikola enthralls the party guests with one of his latest

inventions, an arc lamp. It is the same type of lamp that adorns the top of the Electric Light Tower visible from the family's window, lighting the streets of downtown San Jose. Delighted by the novelty of these fine inventions, Clara's friends and family are charmed by Uncle Nikola and his wonderful electric gifts. One last surprise is in store. Uncle Nikola unveils a large coil, demonstrating the power of electricity, which rivals that of lightning itself!

Clara is fascinated by these scientific marvels, and asks Uncle Nikola question after question. Nikola, who is ready for dinner, distracts her by reminding her of the wooden Nutcracker. She dances with the Nutcracker doll happily, imagining the adventures she might have across the sea where the Nutcracker was made. Fritz would like his sister to play with him instead, and naughtily he grabs the Nutcracker doll, and accidentally breaks it. Devastated. Fritz shows Clara what he has done. But Clara is able to fix the Nutcracker doll, and all is forgiven. The dancing and festivities continue until the guests grow tired and leave, and the family goes to bed.

SCENE 2: THE NUTCRACKER AND THE MOUSE

Clara herself is too excited to sleep. She sneaks back down to the darkened living room to look for her Nutcracker doll. A clock strikes ... and is it a dream, or is it the mischievous mouse General Mousima really here in the living room with Clara? General Mousima, you should know, is the happy leader of the Mouse Army. She wears on her head a Magic Crown. captured from the Nutcracker when he was a Prince! Mousima spies the Nutcracker doll with Clara, and carries it away. Mousima knows that if the Magic Crown is taken from her head, the spell will be broken and the Nutcracker will return to his rightful form, a handsome Prince, beloved of the Sugarplum Fairy herself.

Clara startles awake to discover that her Nutcracker doll is missing! She finds herself in an extraordinary landscape. General Mousima casts a spell and transforms the Electric Light Tower to a height taller almost than can be imagined. The Nutcracker springs to life, full-sized and ready to seize the Magic Crown from Mousima's head. Mousima calls her Mouse Army to protect the Magic Crown. The Nutcracker calls his Toy Soldiers and a contest ensues. Just as things are looking hopeless for the Nutcracker, Clara rescues the Magic Crown from Mousima's head! The spell is ended and the Nutcracker is transformed into a handsome Prince.

SCENE 3: THE LAND OF SNOW

The Prince gives Mousima's Magic Crown to Clara to thank her for her bravery, and the two begin a magical journey. First they must travel across the Land of Snow, where the Queen of Snow grants our two heroes permission to pass through her frozen kingdom on their way to the Sugarplum Fairy. The Queen of Snow calls down a glittering snowstorm and the world becomes bright and sparkles with snowflakes.

ACT II

SCENE 1: THE VALLEY OF HEART'S DELIGHT

The Sugarplum Fairy lives in the Valley of Heart's Delight, a wondrous land carpeted with blossoms, where fruit, flowers, nuts, and treats of all kinds flourish. Surrounded by Dewdrop Fairies and Frogs, the Sugarplum Fairy brings joy and beauty to all she encounters.

A retinue of Fairies and Pages brings the Sugarplum Fairy news: a Prince is arriving from a distant land! Could this be the Sugarplum Fairy's own beloved Prince, lost to her for so long? It is! The Sugarplum Fairy and the Prince are reunited. The Prince explains that it is due to Clara's bravery that Mousima's Magic Crown was reclaimed, breaking the spell that trapped him in the form of a wooden nutcracker. In thanks, the Sugarplum Fairy decrees that the inhabitants of the Valley of Heart's Delight will dance for Clara in celebration.

Spanish Bougainvillea entertain Clara with their vibrant blossoms. A Gilroy Garlic Harvester is mesmerized by a coiling and uncoiling Diamondback Rattlesnake. A dancing Walnut charms with his jumps and leaps, fluttering Apricot Blossoms fill the air with their perfume, lightningfast Quicksilver from the Almaden Hills flashes and shines, and Casa de Fruta herself introduces Clara to her charming dancing Cherries, Plums. and Apricots. Flowers swirl and dip in a glorious waltz, led by the regal California Poppy. At the height of the celebration, the Sugarplum Fairy and the Prince perform a Grand Pas de Deux. They are joined in a triumphant dance by the marvelous characters Clara has met on her adventure.

As the festivities conclude, Clara bids her new friends farewell and begins a journey of new adventures and lands unknown. Towards home or towards new worlds beyond her dreams, Clara's imagination, courage, and kind heart will always be her guides.


DALIA RAWSON

Dalia is the founding director of New Ballet. From 1991 to 2006, she performed a wide variety of leading roles as a dancer with Ballet San Jose under the artistic directorship of Dennis Nahat. Dalia began teaching at BSJ School in 2000, and was named ballet mistress in 2007, principal in 2012, and director in 2014. In 2013, she was awarded a fellowship from the New York Choreographic Institute, an affiliate of New York City Ballet. Dalia is an American Ballet Theatre (ABT) Certified Teacher who has successfully completed the ABT Teacher Training Intensive in primary through level seven of the ABT National Training Curriculum. She is also a member of the ABT Artistic Board of Examiners. Dalia has choreographed the New Ballet productions of *The San Jose Nutcracker*, *Swan Lake*, *Cinderella*, *Sleeping Beauty*, *La Boutique Fantasque*, and numerous contemporary works, creating a body of work for New Ballet that is fast-paced and entertaining while honoring the traditions of classical ballet.


