FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

It is indeed "Great Big Stuff" that we are bringing you our first full-scale musical since the onset of the pandemic shut down our hit production of **Chicago** in early 2020.

Dirty Rotten Scoundrels is a witty, vibrant, and sharply comedic musical that feels exciting and perfectly relevant for The Stage. It's a caper of the con all dressed up in elegant, high society



trappings that not only entertains but also offers a timely reflection on a range of themes that resonate profoundly in today's society.

The musical's glamorous yet deceptive setting in the French Riviera highlights the contrasts between appearance and reality and serves as a metaphor for the allure of wealth and success, encouraging us to look beyond the surface and question what truly matters in life. The art of the con, the hustle, appears so luxurious that we can become the unwitting mark. If there is a morality to be explored, it is shrouded in laughter as a couple of self-aggrandizing cons reap what they sow in a hilarious twist of their own screw.

Conceived as a possible vehicle for Mick Jagger and David Bowie, the 1988 Orion film ultimately starred Steve Martin and Michael Caine as the dastardly-but-dynamic duo of dissemblers. (It is book-

ended cinematically by its 1964 source, **Bedtime Story**, with Marlon Brando and David Niven, and a 2019 gender-bending reinvention, **The Hustle**, starring Rebel Wilson and Anne Hathaway.)

Keeping it's title for Broadway, the 2004 musical adaptation ran for eighteen months, was nominated for eleven Tony Awards, and starred John Lithgow and Norbert Leo Butz, that season's the Tony winner for Best Actor in a Musical. Nestled into the peppy score by David Yazbek (**The Full Monty**, **The Band's Visit**, **Tootsie**) is a slight lyrical reference to one of the biggest con men ever! Can you spot it?

Once again, The Stage is indebted to an amazing creative team, outstanding cast, and swinging band for bringing this delightful production to life and delivering the exceptional quality that our audiences have come to expect. In these often challenging times, we are thrilled to offer you a chance to relax, to laugh, to reflect, and to enjoy all **Dirty Rotten Scoundrels** has to offer!

Jeffrey Lane is an author, television scriptwriter, film producer, and actor. He is a graduate of Wesleyan University. Jeffrey wrote the book for the musical **Dirty Rotten** Scoundrels, which ran on Broadway in 2005 and was nominated for the Tony Award for Best Musical. He has written the book for the musical adaptation **Women on the Verge of a Nervous Breakdown**.

David Yazbek

Music and Lyrics

David Yazbek has a varied career as a recording artist, Emmy-winning television and film writer, music producer, and pianist, which has somehow led him to a career on Broadway. His four productions, The Full Monty, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, Women on the Verge of a Nervous Breakdown, and The Band's Visit were all Tony nominated for Best Score. David took home the Tony for Best Score for The Band's Visit. The Full Monty won him the Drama Desk Award for Best Music. His most recent new musical Dead Outlaw just closed a successful Off-Broadway run on April 4, 2024. As a recording artist, David is responsible for five albums: The Laughing Man (winner NAIRD award, Best Pop Album of the Year), Tock, Damascus, Tape Recorder, and Evil Monkey Man. He also produced the original cast albums of The Band's Visit, The Full Monty, Dirty Rotten Scoundrels, and Women on the Verge of a Nervous Breakdown, the first three of which were nominated for Grammy Awards. David scored the final season of Boardwalk **Empire** (HBO), scored and performed the music for the giant Broadway hit Fish in the Dark by Larry David, and built an Ikea storage shelf. He teamed up with 13 librettist Robert Horn to collaborate on the musical Tootsie, which won the Tony for Best Book of a Musical and was nominated for a total of eleven Tony Awards, including Best Musical.

Johnny Moreno Director

Johnny is an associate artist of San Jose Stage Company, director, fight choreographer, stunt man, and actor. She has served on the Theatre Service Committee for Theatre Bay Area, the SoFA Leadership Committee, and recently participated as a member of the Greater Downtown San Jose Economic Recovery Task Force which leveraged additional funding for the arts in San Jose. In addition, she has served on grant panels for the City of San Jose and SVCreates, among others, and also served as an Arts Advisory Council member

for the performance venue design process for Evergreen Valley College. Cathleen established a three-year educational outreach partnership with Notre Dame High School in San Jose and has adjudicated for many local high school and college theatre programs. She is the recipient of several distinguished awards including the 2018 Cornerstone of the Arts Award from the San José Arts Commission, as well as the 2018 Paine Knickerbocker Award for Continuing Contributions to Bay Area Theatre from the San Francisco Bay Area Theatre Critics Circle.

Randall King* Artistic Director

Randall is the artistic director and cofounder of San Jose Stage Company. Under his leadership, The Stage has produced over two hundred plays and musicals and premiered over fifty new works, including twenty world premieres. Randall is the recipient of the 2018 City of San José Cornerstone of the Arts Award for providing enduring and effective leadership that contributes to the betterment of the San José arts community. Directing credits include a three-month extended run of Picasso at the Lapin Agile by Steve Martin, the world premiere of Cumberland Blues, the Grateful Dead musical featuring music and lyrics by Jerry Garcia and Robert Hunter that transferred to San Francisco, the Tuna trilogy (Greater Tuna, A Tuna Christmas, and Red, White and Tuna),

R.F.K. (SFBATCC award), **Hand to God**, and most recently, the critically acclaimed production of **Chicago**. He has performed in leading roles at many theatres including San Jose Repertory Theatre, Berkeley Repertory Theatre, Sacramento Theatre Company, and the Alaska Theatre Festival. On screen, Randall has acted in **The Rainmaker** (directed by Francis Ford Coppola), **Mumford** (directed by Lawrence Kasdan), and **The Rock** (directed by Michael Bay). He has also performed in numerous television productions.
